2013 Tiffany Phillips Scholar-Athlete Scholarship

This annual \$2,000 scholarship was established in 1998, in memory of Tiffany Phillips, the teenage daughter of Steve and Dana Phillips, Oregon.

Tiffany, who lost her life in a tragic accident in 1998, was both an outstanding scholar and an exceptional athlete. This academic scholarship is funded in equal grants from Steve and Dana Phillips and the Miss America Organization. It is presented to an outstanding scholar-athlete that participated in the Miss America program during the current year regardless of whether a title was won.

2013 Eugenia Vellner-Fischer Award for the Performing Arts

This award, sponsored by the family of Mrs. Fischer, is for contestants wishing to pursue a career in the performing arts. This includes dance, instrumental, monologue and vocal.

David B. Allman Medical Scholarship

In memory of Dr. David B. Allman, a past President of the American Medical Association and later, by Mrs. Allman and funded by their estate, this scholarship is available to contestants wishing to enter the field of medicine.

JEAN BARTEL MILITARY AWARENESS SCHOLARSHIP

Jean took on the commitment of a "War-Time" Miss America to heart, as she embarked on a Bond-selling tour that would result in her being honored by the United States Treasury Department as the individual who had sold the most Series E Bonds that year. Two and one half million dollars worth, and surprisingly most of these twenty-five dollar bonds were sold to women.

Applicants will be considered for this award based upon a combination of factors including, but not limited to, grade point average (high school & college/university), class rank, extra-curricular activities, financial aid requirements, household income and level of participation within the MAO system and an essay describing how the applicant fulfilled a legitimate need in their community through the creation, development and/or participation in a community based project or event to raise the awareness of our

proud military men and women who dedicate their lives for our freedom.

This award will be granted annually totaling \$13,000, (Winner \$6,000, 1st Runner-Up \$4,000 and 2nd Runner-Up \$3,000), if there are qualified applicants, to those women in the Miss America system who meet the requirements for a grant of scholarship. The scholarship is available to women who have competed on the local, state or national level from 2003 to present regardless of whether a title was won.

Jean Bartel Quality of Life Scholarship Award

The 2014 Quality of Life Award honors Jean Bartel's memory and is available to the 53 contestants competing for the title of Miss America who exhibit exemplary community spirit.

Initiated in 1988, the Quality of Life Scholarship was the first community service related award presented to Miss America Contestants. All 53 contestants competing for the title of Miss America are eligible for this award. Applicants must excel in their commitment to enhancing the quality of life for others through volunteerism and community service. The applicants must demonstrate that they have fulfilled a legitimate need in their community through the creation, development and/or participation in a community service project.

A separate Quality of Life panel of judges consisting of community leaders and former Miss Americas will review the applications and determine the top three (3) Quality of Life scholarship recipients. Please see the attached application for more information.
